3. Summer School & Grade Recovery

Parents, this summer will be different than previous years. Though summer school is an option, it is much more limited this year due to budget cuts. Therefore, DJMS is doing everything in our power to ensure grade recovery for our students. As a friendly reminder, students must pass ALL 4 core (Math, ELA, Social Studies, and Science) to be promoted to the next grade level. Failure to do so will result in grade retention. The 4th quarter is traditionally the poorest performing quarter. Therefore, please help us monitor your child's progress.

4. Behavior During Testing

Parents, I will have a zero-tolerance policy on inappropriate behavior during the testing windows. If a student purposely misbehaves and potentially invalidates a score, the discipline consequence will be an automatic day of Out of School Suspension. Please have serious conversation with your students about the importance of the testing integrity. **Note, this includes purposeful rushing of other students during the testing window.**

Parent Portal Sign Up

The best way to know live data of your student's performance is through the parent portal! Here you can see grades, attendance, discipline referrals, teacher notes, and testing information in live time. For your reference, below you will find the attachment to sign up. I highly recommend this for all parents!

Parents- summer is around the corner! Below are strategies parents can begin to have a great summer!

1. Set Academic Goals and Reflect Together

Take time to sit with your child and reflect on the current school year—what went well, what was challenging, and what they want to improve. Together, set realistic academic goals for the summer (e.g., reading a certain number of books, practicing math skills weekly) and the upcoming school year. This helps build self-awareness and motivation.

2. Create a Balanced Summer Routine

Structure is key, even during summer break. Establish a daily routine that includes time for reading, learning activities (like educational games or online resources), physical activity, chores, and free time. A consistent routine helps students maintain good habits and eases the transition back to school in the fall.

3. Enroll in Enrichment Opportunities

Look into summer camps, workshops, or local library programs that focus on STEM, art, writing, or leadership skills. These programs keep students mentally engaged and may even introduce them to new interests or talents that can be nurtured in the next school year.
