

X_{AVID} Advancement Via Individual Determination

Did you know Celebration K-8 has a college preparatory elective available to our 7th and 8th graders called AVID? AVID is a yearlong elective aimed at providing our students with academic, social, and emotional support to develop their academic skills and enhance their scholastic success. AVID is for students who have the desire and willingness to work but may not have all the tools they need to flourish. AVID teaches students the skills and behaviors required for academic success. Over the year they will work together as a class learning WICOR (writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization and reading), plus time management and problem-solving skills. AVID students are proven to graduate and attend college at higher rates; but more importantly, they are more equipped to think critically, set high expectations, and confidently conquer the challenges that await them.
