An Area of Focus in the Celebration K-8 School Improvement Plan for this year is decreasing the number of students who are considered chronically absent. Chronic absence-missing 10 percent or more of school days due to absence for any reason-excused, unexcused absences and suspensions -can translate into students having difficulty learning to read by the third grade, achieving in middle school, and graduating from high school (attendance Works). When it reaches high levels, it can also harm students who are not chronically absent because teachers find it harder to engage all students when they are focused on helping students who were absent catch up on missed learning. Over 200 students were considered chronically absent at our school last year. We believe that we can lower that number by educating about the importance of attendance and early interventions. We will include information about attendance in each of these newsletters and look forward to working with you to lower the number of chronically absent students.
