





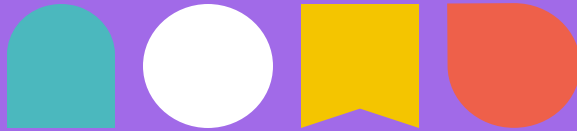

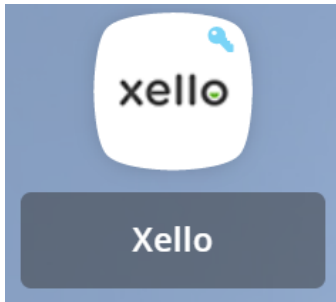
- Khan academy is a free resource provided by College Board to assist in test preparation. If students have not taken the PSAT or SAT, they can take a diagnostic test and Khan Academy will personalize the test preparation to meet the needs of the student. Once a student has taken a College Board exam, students can link their College Board and Khan Academy accounts and will be provided that personalized test prep. Our School District offers all 9th and 10th graders the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT for free during a school day in the fall. This practice SAT provides resources for students to continue to focus on academic strengths and weaknesses. All 11th graders are again provided the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT for free during a school day, but this score will be used by College Board to recognize students as National Merit Scholars (based on scores determined by College Board). 11th and 12th graders are also provided the opportunity to take the SAT and ACT during the school day for free. As students continue to take advantage of the testing opportunities, our guidance is for them to utilize Khan Academy. For 8th graders taking the SAT, these scores will not be a part of the students permanent College Board record unless a request is written to College Board. As a district, we do not publish national tests on student transcripts. Colleges and Universities require all national tests be sent as official score reports from either ACT or SAT. If the student may be interested in participating in Dual Enrollment, the scores must be kept official through College Board and are good for 2 years. Please note that the letter to the address listed above must contain the student's identification information (name, date of birth, registration number (which can be found on the test ticket), and test date. Regardless of when an 8th grader tests, College Board must receive this written

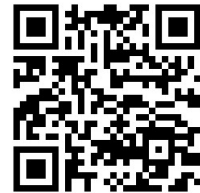

In Osceola County, we use the same College and Career exploration platform for grades Kindergarten through 12th grade. Students have access to Xello within their ClassLink. The single sign-on gives students the advantage of utilize this application at any time. Through Xello, students can take different inventories, search careers and post-secondary plans, build resumes, create a storyboard of important resources, and many other things.
