SAFETY SPOTLIGHT

Navigate 360 is a new company to SDOC. The



program was purchased at the December Board meeting. Navigate 360 is not new to the school district, and we utilize their services on each campus through School Check-In.

As we introduce the program, the primary function of Navigate 360 will be Threat Assessment Training for teams at each site. The training will be divided into two parts. The first part is on-line and self paced, and the second part being a virtual meeting.

As we become more familiar with Navigate, we will also utilize the emergency planning and facility planning tools in the software.

SAFETY SHOUT-OUT

TECHNOLOGY

Gaggle is software the district uses to monitor student and staff Office 360 Accounts. It will scan documents, email, One Drive, and any document saved in the account. All notifications are sent to the school administration, and district personnel.



Content Keeper monitors district internet web searches.

Once a key word is triggered notification is sent to the SSEM Office. One of the district monitors them emails the school to investigate, and requests feedback on the result of the investigation.

MENTAL HEALTH

Safety plans are a key tool for student success. If an incident requires a threat assessment, and the threat is determined to be "very serious substantive" a safety plan is required.

However, you are permitted to complete a safety plan for any threat to self or others if the Threat Assessment Team deems necessary.

Additionally, a safety plan can be created for any student behavior that is a concern to the health and safety of the student or other students in the school.

DID YOU KNOW?

If your SRO is involved in an emergency situation, you do not need to contact 911. Your SRO is 911, and they can get necessary resources on site faster than explaining details to a dispatcher.

But in an emergency do not hesitate to dial 9-1-1 if you feel it is necessary.
