Greetings Dolphin Family,

We are off to a great start. We are in the process of distributing our students' individual digital devices. What a fantastic benefit our District has offered us! Each child will have their own device for home and school use. Our Technology Specialist, Instructional Coaches, and teachers are working diligently to complete this process and to plan for increased use of technology in their daily lessons.

We received our FSA scores from the State. These scores include English Language Arts (ELA) and Math for grades 3-5 and Science for grade 5. Statewide decreases were expected considering the number of students who could not attend school face to face during the 2020-21 school year. However, Lakeview defied the odds and produced some remarkable outcomes! Third Grade Reading lead the charge! Below is the summary of that data. It is extraordinary!

- Only 8 non-charter, District, elementary schools experienced an increase in the percentage of 3rd grade students scoring at a Level 3 or higher.
- Lakeview had the 3rd largest increase of 9% moving from 50% to 59% proficient.
- After applying the "school grade rules" to the data, Lakeview tied for the highest increase of 10% moving from 53% to 63% proficient.

In other State assessed grades and subjects, our students did much better than expected for a pandemic year, and when compared to other Osceola County K-5 schools, Lakeview consistently performs at the top.
