During our January 28, 2021 Learning Cycle visit the following positive areas were identified and measured:

- > 100% of teachers are using the Curriculum Unit Maps.
- > 97% of our classrooms were on pace.
- > 97% were using curriculum materials.
- ➢ 56% of classrooms were reading complex text.
- > 31% of classrooms were writing. (improvement)
- Student talking has increased as the students feel more comfortable.
- > 56% of classrooms showed evidence of problem solving.
- > 87% of the classrooms were engaged in one component of RWTS.
- > Teachers are monitoring at a rate of 50%.
- ➢ 45% of classrooms are authentically engaged.
- > Teachers are building relationships and holding high expectations for all students.

In addition, we were able to meet our growth goals in 4th Grade ELA and 5th Grade Science. We have put corrective reading in place for our below grade level students in grades 3-5 and Open Court implementation in grades K-2. These instructional models have provided us with good growth data. Monthly collection of student writing samples from K-5 are showing improvement and the majority of students are approaching grade level expectations in writing. When comparing our mid-year data to all 26 K-5 schools in our district, Lakeview rates 5th in ELA, 8th in Math and 9th in Science.
