Your children will develop excellent communication skills as they present their problems to peers, practice problem solving techniques, and develop high level questioning as they support each other in the tutorial process. Our students will have the opportunity to present their tutorials on Friday, October 6th during our AVID Showcase. These types of opportunities develop confidence and foster leadership among AVID students. Please take time to ask your child about AVID tutorials and have them share the process with you. Although it may be a bit intimidating at first, in very little time, we see the benefits begin to immerge and student confidence begins to build. By the end of the year, they are experts at presenting and their grades are a reflection of their efforts to support each other.




OCTOBER NEWS




- You are not free to come and go as you wish.
