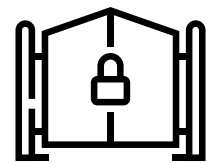
KEEPING OSCEOLA SCHOOL DISTRICT STUDENTS AND STAFF SAFE

## DOORS LOCKED



All school classrooms and other instructional spaces must be locked when occupied by students, except between class periods when students are moving between classrooms or other instructional spaces. Doors unlocked or open for any other reason must be actively staffed by a person standing or seated at the door.

## GATES & ACCESS POINTS LOCKED



All gates or other campus access points that restrict ingress to or egress from a school campus must be closed and locked when students are on campus.

All access doors, gates, and other access points that allow ingress to or egress from a school building must be closed and locked at all times.

## SAFE AREAS IN CLASSROOMS MARKED



All school classrooms and other instructional spaces must clearly and conspicuously mark the safest areas where students must shelter in an emergency. Students must be notified of these safe areas within the first 10 days of the school year.

## FORTIFY FLORIDA



All students will receive age and developmentally-appropriate instruction on the proper use of the FortifyFL mobile suspicious activity reporting tool within the first five days of the school year. The instruction must include the consequences for making a threat or false report via FortifyFL.

## RANDOM SEARCHES IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS



Random searches of students' belongings (students' bookbags and other containers, including lunchboxes and purses) in grades 6-12 will take place on a regular basis this school year. Searches will be conducted by school administration and principal designees utilizing handheld metal detection devices. An electronic randomization tool located and managed at the district level will be used to randomly select the classroom searches. Searches will be conducted with the utmost respect for students' privacy and dignity.

## NO DRONES ALLOWED OVERHEAD



Expansion of the Unmanned Aircraft Systems Act Section 330.41, F.S., was amended to provide criminal penalties for the operation of a drone over a public school serving students in any grade from prekindergarten to grade 12, and for allowing a drone to make contact with any school, person, or object on the school campus. Exceptions exist for law enforcement agencies and drone operators with prior written consent from school officials.

## DUAL-ENROLLED STUDENTS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY



The Superintendent must notify a college or university Chief of Police or Public Safety Director whenever a dual-enrolled student is taken into custody by law enforcement for certain serious offenses.

## COMPLIANCE REPORT FOR SCHOOL SAFETY



House Bill 1473 directs the Office of Safe Schools (OSS) compliance staff to conduct unannounced inspections of all public and public charter schools every three years, while school is in session. Results of these inspections will be documented using the District Compliance Inspection Report.
