Families with students attending a Non-CEP (Community Eligibility Provision) school and wishing to benefit from the National School Lunch Program for the 2024-25 academic year must submit an application to receive free and reduced-price meals.

Families with students attending a CEP school will not be required to complete a meal application to participate in the National School Lunch Program, they will receive free breakfast at lunch during the school year.
