ESE UPDATE by Keisy Campos

Ms. Campos gave a brief overview of the school's ESOL program. ESOL services are provided for any student who speaks a language other than English at home. The school has two ESOL specialists and 5 ESOL paraprofessionals. Students ESOL services are determined by answering three questions during registration and the results of a test given within the first 20 days of enrollment. 365 students are currently receiving ESOL services. Students can receive accommodations but not modifications to the curriculum.

SAFETY REPORT Mr. Weeden on behalf of Deputy Plaza

Mr. Weeden briefed SAC on a recent REMIND message regarding community safety. The school is considering ideas to bring awareness to e-bike safety. The school is trying to work with the community on e-bikes, parking, etc.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Mr. Weeden reviewed PM2 data by sub-groups. 58% of 3rd graders are proficient in ELA already. 52% of students are showing proficiency in ELA and 41% of students are showing learning gains. 33% of students are showing proficiency in Math and 20% are making learning gains. Mr. Weeden is predicting 64% of students will show proficiency in Science, goal is 70% and 55.6% in Civics. Many celebrations over last year's mid-point data. School is continuing to work with individual students on individual standards.
