### Extinct Jobs

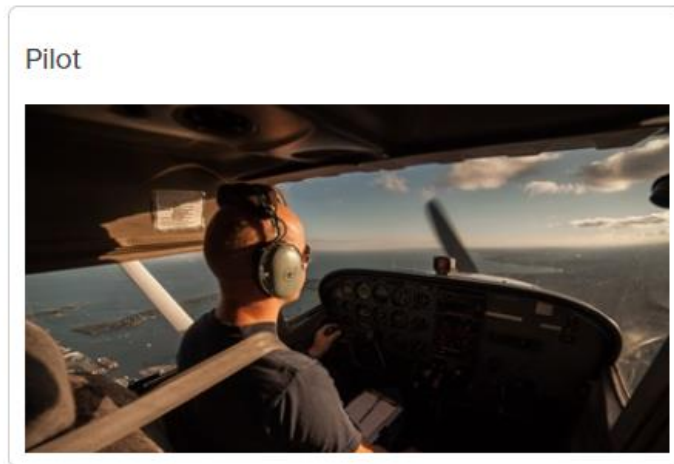

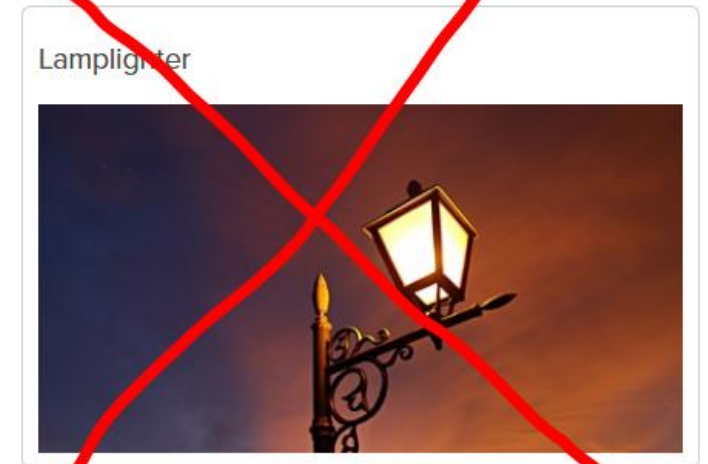

## Job Outlook Pop Quiz

Did the log drivers, lamplighters, and pinsetters of the past know their jobs were going to go extinct? What jobs might not exist anymore by the time you’re ready to enter the workforce?

Governments collect and report all kinds of information about jobs and workers. That includes projections about how many jobs there will be in the future. This is called job outlook. It can tell you which careers will be in demand in the future, and which jobs will experience a slow down.

## Factors that Affect Career Demand

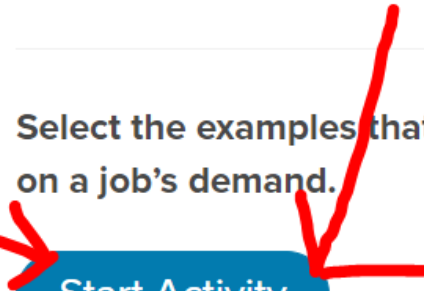

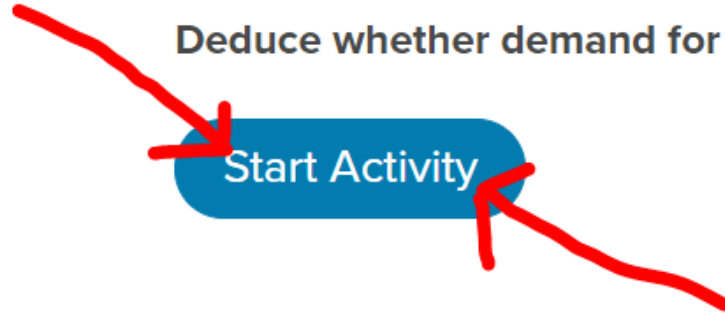
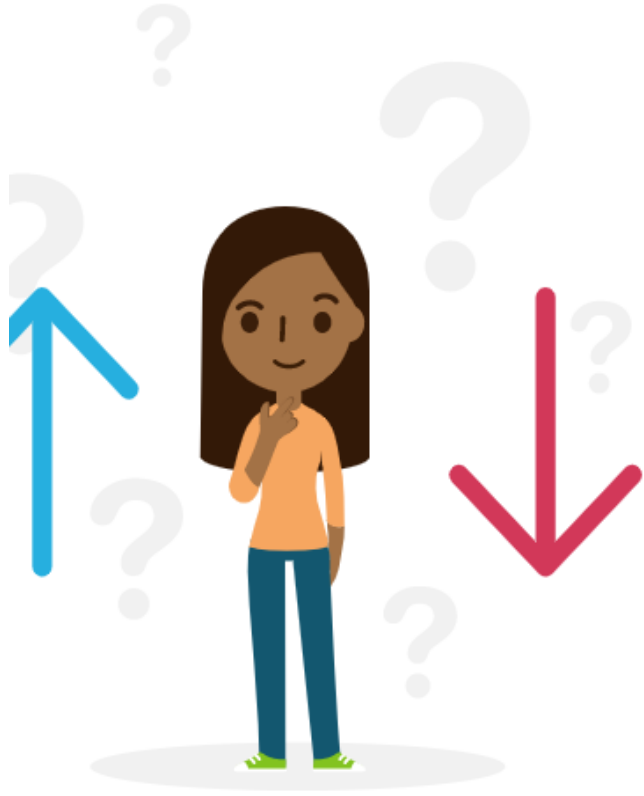
## Growing or Slowing?

# Career Exploration

Career demand shouldn't be the only thing you consider when exploring your options. There are a lot other things that can help you determine whether or not a career is a good fit for you. But thinking about which jobs will be available (and why) when you're ready to enter the workforce can help you plan for the future.

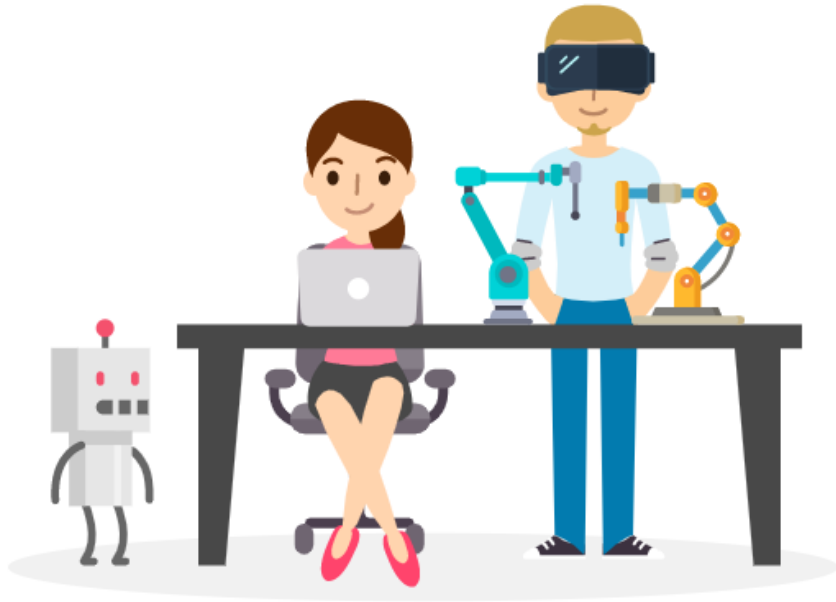


# Timeline Twist

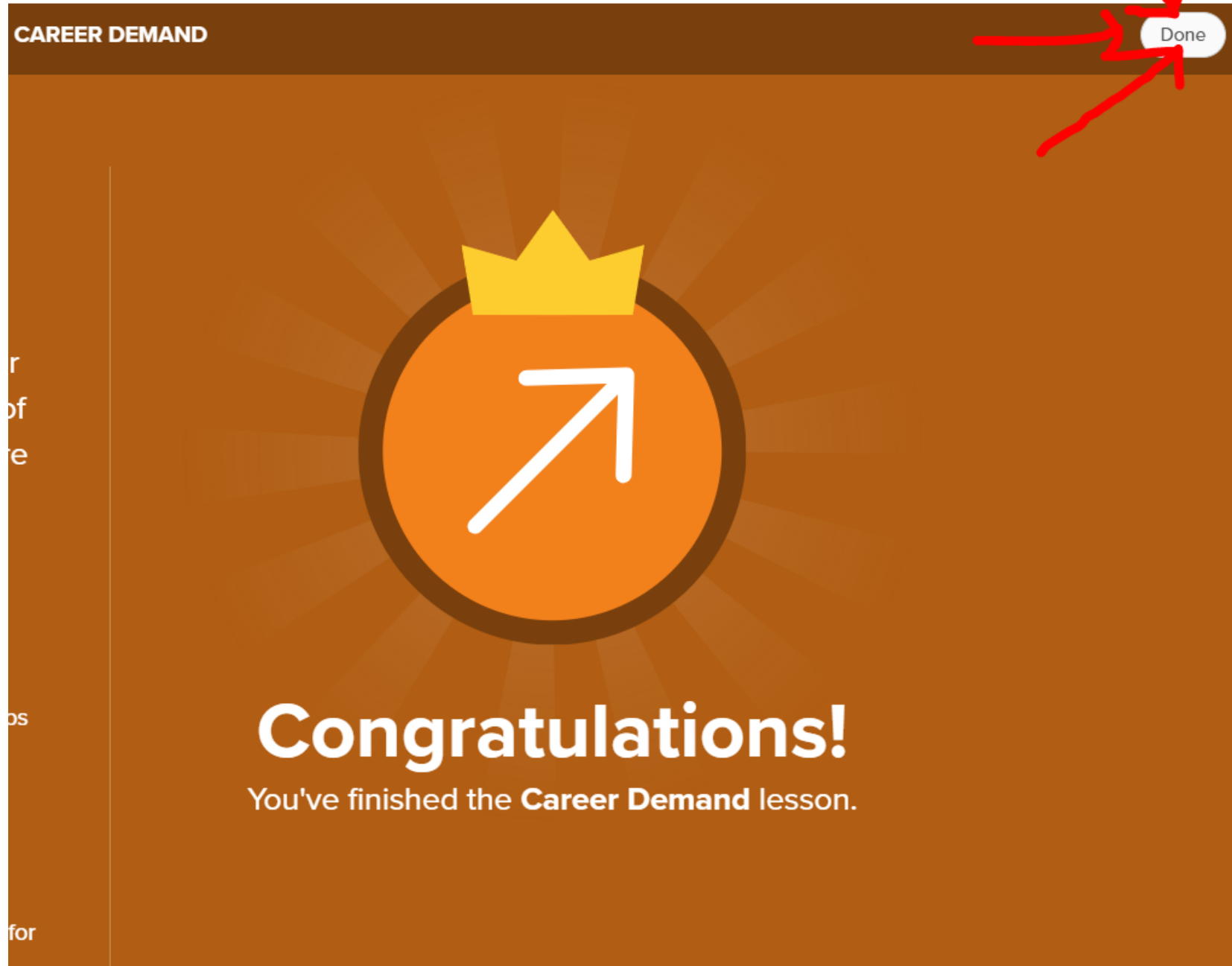

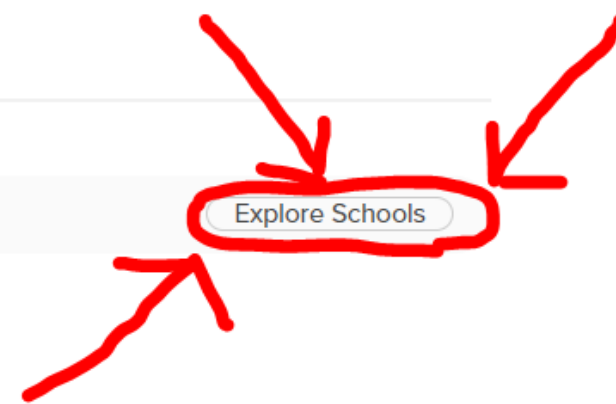

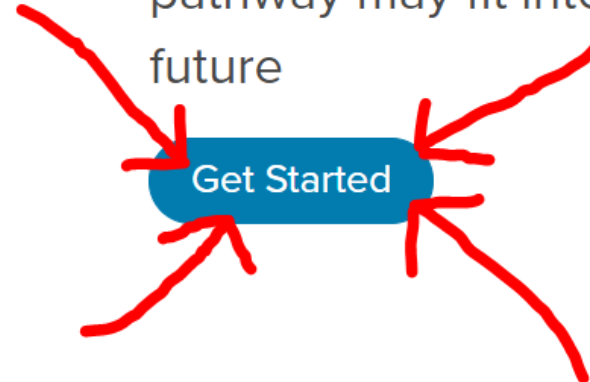
