The program will cover the Role of the FTO Program, Responsibilities of the FTO, Elements of Adult Learning and Instruction, Effective Communication Skills for the FTO, Supervision and Leadership by the FTO, On-the-Job Counseling as an FTO, Structure of the Field Training Evaluation, the Daily Observation Report, Role of Reports and Meetings, and Remedial Training.
