Student Technology Devices

Parents and students,

The School District of Osceola County is happy to once again distribute Technology Devices for students to assist in the curriculum for the 2023-2024 school year. Students enrolled in SDOC will receive technology equipment that will be checked out to them for **educational uses only**. The device is allowed to go home with the student and returned each day for classroom use. A borrower's form will be completed, documenting the agreement between the student, family, and school district.

We will be checking out a laptop or iPad, a charger, and a case to each student to use at school and home. The devices for grades 2-12 will be an 11- inch lightweight Dell or Lenovo laptop. The devices for grades K-1 will be an iPad. The school also has Hotspots available for checkout.

The student will need to bring the device to school every day fully charged ready for class. The device will be filtered and monitored during school and home use. Students will be responsible for taking care of all equipment and **returning it in the same condition** in which it was provided. If any equipment is intentionally damaged or lost while it is checked out to a student, they must contact the school and a fee will be issued based on the situation.

Procedures taken if Technology equipment is stolen, damaged, or not returned:

1. If device is broken or stolen, report immediately to school personnel.
2. District will deactivate the device if not returned or stolen.
3. Assess Student Discipline if deemed it was intentionally damaged.
4. Parent will file an incident report with the school SRO if device is stolen.
5. If not returned at the end of agreement, SDOC will file a police report.
