Effective July 1, 2019, there is a promotion requirement for middle grades students to complete a Career and Education Planning course before entering ninth grade. Teachers working in coordination with their school counselors are expected to develop and teach lessons that addresses college and career readiness by integrating the eight career and education planning course standards. This instruction has already been factored into the pacing guides for each Social Studies course's CUPs. The School District of Osceola County has selected the Xello platform to deliver the majority of this content that assists students in exploring career options and developing an academic and career plan.
