A minimum of 24 credits are required for graduation. In addition, each student must complete .5 credits in an online course, as well as, pass various state assessments.

AP & DE courses are weighted by one (1) point and Honors courses by one half (.5) point.

Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is calculated in January and June.

Osceola County School for the Arts is a specialized public school serving the needs of 6- 12th grade multi-ethnic, multi-cultural student body through diverse programs and activities that emphasize the arts. The school year (August-June) is organized into two semesters, 18 weeks each with six 90-minute class periods meeting every other day and one 50-minute class period meeting every day, 5 days a week. Osceola County School for the Arts opened in 2003. The faculty is comprised of 54 certified staff, 58% of whom hold a master's degree.

This school is considered a choice school which requires an application in addition to an audition or a portfolio. The art majors are as follows: Band, Orchestra, Vocal Performance, Dance, Drama, Technical Theatre, Creative Writing and Visual Arts.

Osceola County School for the Arts also added the Avid program in 2016. AVID is a college readiness system that is designed to increase school wide learning and performance. Through the use of research based methods of instructions, the program provides meaningful and motivational learning.
