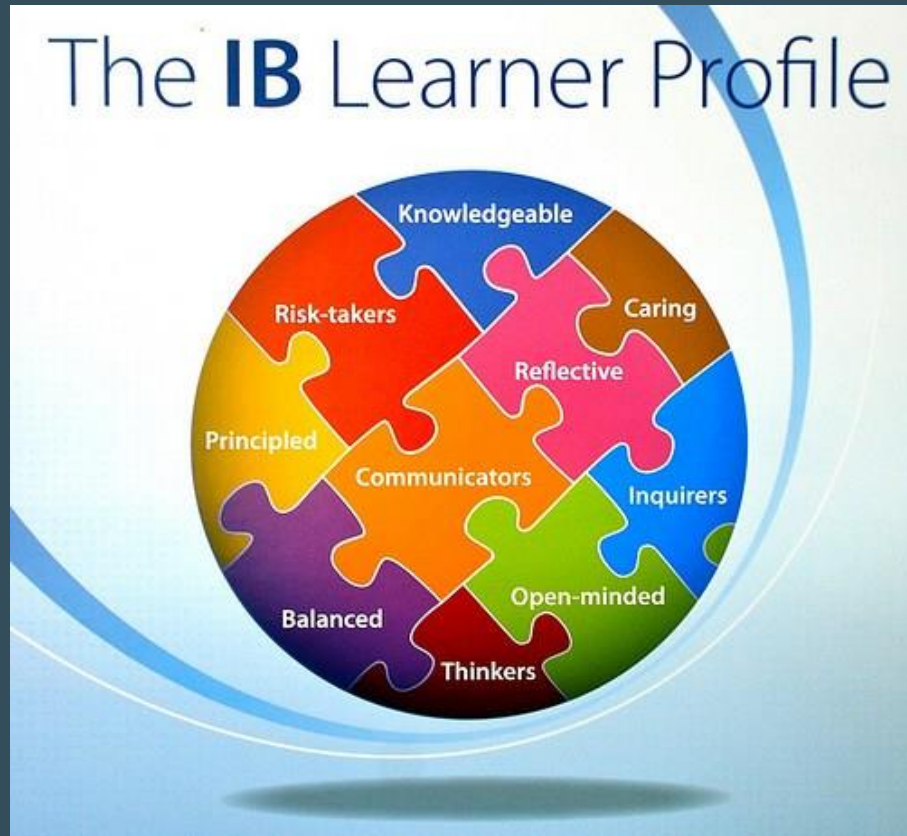



# How to Earn the IB Diploma

Diploma Candidates must study six subjects, plus the three core subjects - EE, TOK and CAS



They must accumulate no fewer than 24 points from assessment in these subjects

# The IB Diploma

**Each subject is graded 1-7, with 7 being the highest grade**

- Combination of EAs and IAs for each course
- These grades are also used as points (Grade 7 = 7 points, etc.)

**TOK and the EE are graded A-E, with A being the highest grade.**

- These two grades are combined to contribute between 0-3 bonus points.

**CAS is not assessed but must be completed in order to receive the diploma.**

# The IB Diploma



With the top score for each course being a 7, plus a possible 3 points from TOK/EE, the overall *maximum* points is 45.




The *minimum* points for the award of the Diploma is 24.



If a candidate scores less than 24 points, the Diploma is not awarded.

# Additional Requirements: Subject Grades

There is **no Grade 1** awarded in a subject/level

There are **no more than two Grade 2s** awarded (SL or HL)

There are **no more than three Grade 3s** or below awarded (SL or HL)

The candidate has **gained 12 points or more on HL subjects**

- (For candidates that register for four HL subjects, the three highest grades count)

The candidate has **gained 9 points or more on SL subjects**

- (Candidates who register for two SL subjects must gain at least 5 points at SL)

- solving problems creatively.

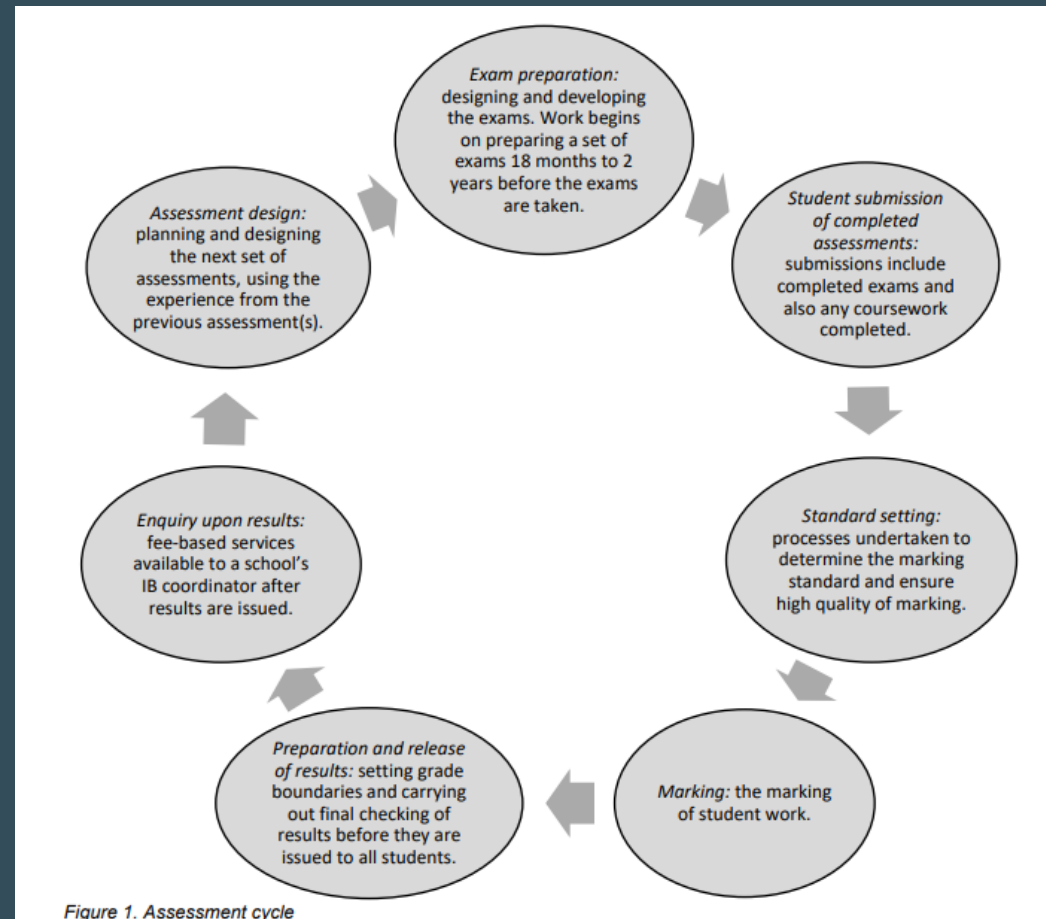
# IB Programme Courses

Student results are determined by performance against set standards, not by each student's position in the overall rank order.

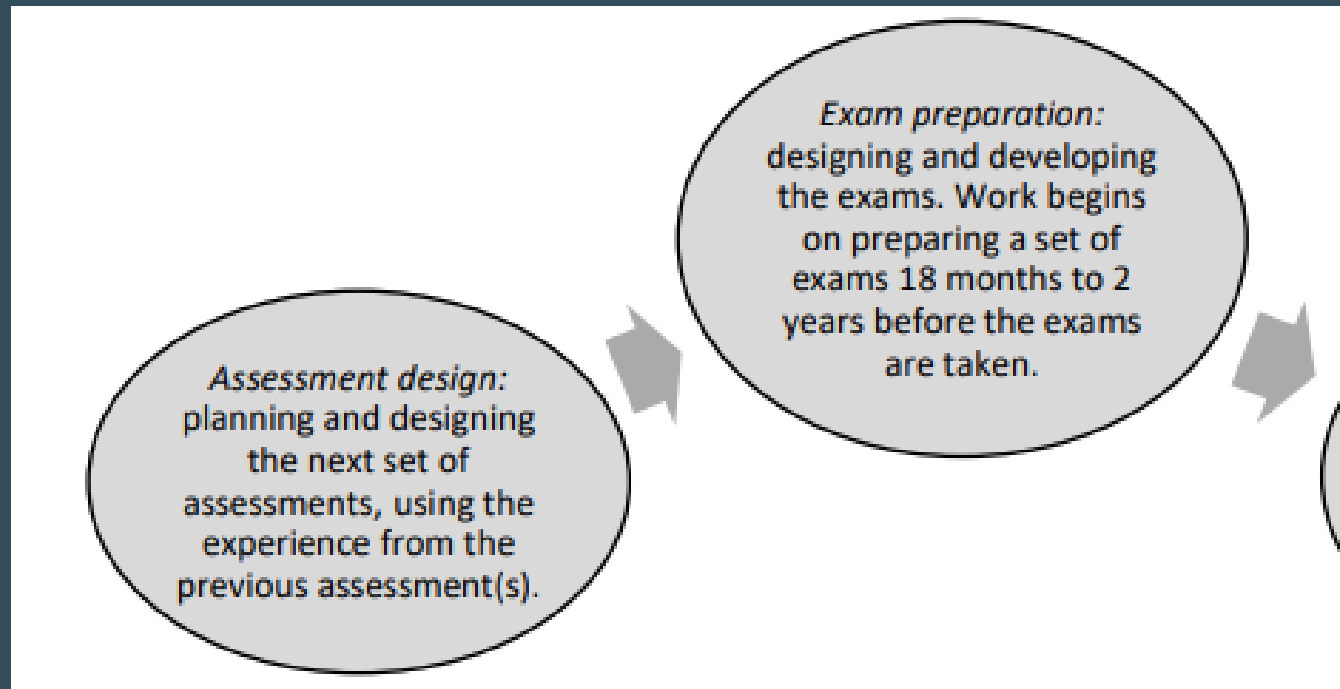

# IB Programme Courses

What's the difference between a mark/level\*  
and a grade?

In the IB, marking and grading student work  
are two different actions.



# IB Programme Courses

## Marking

When work is marked, you are given credit for the work you have produced against a markscheme, rubric or similar framework.

Marks show how much of the assessment task you got right. The mark itself has no other meaning.

# IB Programme Courses

## Grading

In deciding a grade, the examiner is making a judgment on the quality of your work against a defined standard. This takes into account the difficulty of the task as well as the number of marks given.

Grades have a particular meaning and relevance, and they are intended to be comparable with grades in other subjects.

# IB Programme Courses

Consider:

Marks are how far you have walked, but grades take into account how steep the path was.

When IB Grades are awarded (the process of converting marks into grades) they take place shortly before the issue of results.

# IB Programme Courses

Who are the examiners?

The IB only appoints examiners who are subject experts and have teaching experience. The majority of examiners are experienced IB teachers. Examiners undergo training before marking and receive detailed information about how to award marks. There are a number of different examiner roles with varying responsibilities.

All examiners are responsible for marking. Team leaders are senior examiners who provide guidance and feedback to the examiners.

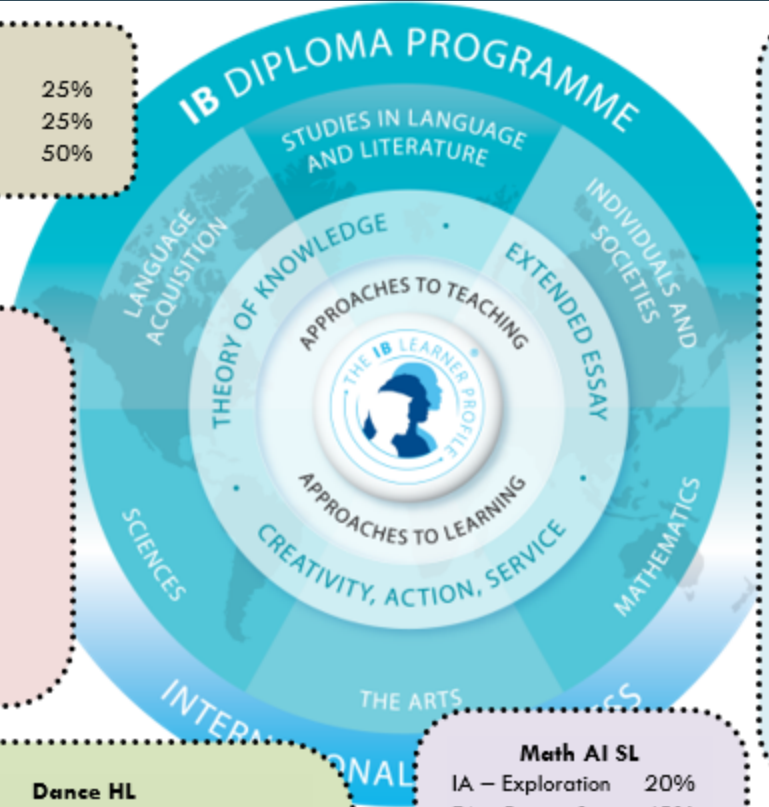

# IB Examinations



All exams will be held in the Media Center. You will enter and exit through the exterior doors

This is 30 minutes prior to the start of the exam.



If you have a modified testing schedule due to conflicts, I will meet with you individually to discuss your schedule



As a reminder, students will no longer be able to leave the exam early. All students must remain supervised without access to technology until the end of the exam window.



# Examination Day

Students will enter and exit through the exterior doors of the media center at either 8:30am or 12:30am.

Students must *not* linger/roam on campus prior to exams or once the exam releases. The expectation is that students will only be on campus for the duration of their exam and leave immediately after using the designated exit.

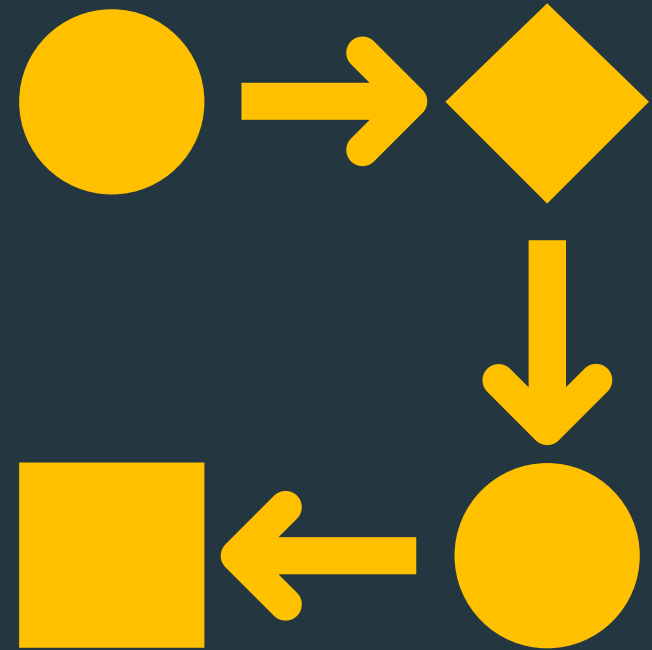

Can I challenge my results?

If a candidate would like the IB to re-mark their work, they should approach their school's DP/CP coordinator to discuss available options since he/she would need to place the request (called enquiry upon results) on the candidate's behalf.

# Results

Can I challenge my results?

Yes. The enquiry upon results (EUR) services can be used if you or your school feel that your results are not a fair reflection of your performance.

There is a charge for each service, but the charge for a category 1 remark is refunded if your grade changes. It is important to realize that your subject grade may be raised or lowered as a result of a category 1 re-mark.
